1. Call Meeting to Order

Meeting called to order at 10:00 AM on 10/29/2021

2. Approve Agenda

Rob Sommers motioned to approve agenda. Second by Jeff Hartman. Approved unanimously

3. Approve Minutes from 4/19/2021 and 5/5/2021

Motion to approve by Rob Sommers. Second by Jeff Hartman. Passed unanimously.

4. Legislative Updates for LIOs Jeremiah Erickson, (Monroe County)

The following land information related bills were mentioned as having activity

- AB387 Shoreland Zoning Ordinance (Passed)
- AB395 Redistricting Plan Standards (No movement)
- AB449/SB482 School district blueprints to law enforcement (Passed)
- AB560/SB575 Property Tax exemptions for Reg. Planning Comms.
- AB621/SB624 Legislative redistricting
- SB625 Congressional Redistricting
- AB623/SB641 Personal property tax reimbursement back to communities (No movement)
- AB610/SB630 Tax assessor's practices bill (Passed assembly, sent to senate.)
- Forthcoming WLTA Bill on easement sunset
- Forthcoming NG911 Grant appropriations. Looking for support/sponsorship.
- Adam Dorn mentioned Chapter 980 youth center changes potentially forthcoming

5. State Agency Geospatial Information Committee (SAGIC) Update, Felipe Avila (SAGIC/Dane Co.)

- SAGIC has developed a draft history document of the committee.
- Discussing shared services for the group. (Centerline, addresses, etc.)
- Seeking licensing flexibility from ESRI.

6. Legislative Technology Service Bureau Update, Ryan Squires (LTSB)

- Thanked membership for feedback and participation.
- Displayed map of statewide tentative supervisory districts and wards (as completed)
- Provided numbers on various stage completions statewide
- Reminders of populations <1000 not required to submit as well as reconciliation/ward conflict fix process.
- Sending completed information to WEC as they receive it.
- Will only solicit MCD boundaries from 1/5 to 1/19 as part of data submission. No need for wards.
- Damkot (Washington County) asked whether Alderman ID could be a required field in WISE Decade? This could aid in 2031 redistricting process instead of municipalities having to create brand new Aldermanic plans. (Could use existing)

- Sommers (Green County) asked if the legislature changes ward boundaries during their redistricting, does the work fall back on locals or LTSB?

7. Department of Administration (DOA) program update, Jim Giglierano

- Lidar status available at <https://geodata.wisc.edu/>
- Submitting proposals for 2022 3DEP funding which will help fill statewide coverage.
- Est. for LiDAR statewide coverage cost \$13 million, \$5 million of which came from Counties.
- USGS Hydrography from LiDAR. DOA would like to pilot a couple of counties.

DOA/WLIP Update, Peter Herreid (DOA)

- All draft Land Information Plans have been submitted. Thanked the LIOs for the effort.
- 15 plans need revisions or content added because of new template
- Final Land Information plans due by 12/31.
- Encouraged feedback on peer review process. (Email Peter)
- 2021 recordings up significantly resulting in \$1.4 million in revenue, most since 2007.
- Increased revenue means 2022 SIGs will be funded at 60K level.
- 42 Counties eligible for base budget awards.
- Statewide Parcel Benchmarks (1-3) expected to remain the same.
- Strategic Initiative grant \$ is not intended for day-to-day operating costs. Intended for specific projects.
- Sommers mentioned getting PLSS rolled into parcels is key part of Benchmark 4, and recommended this aspect be discussed in county land information plans.
- Herreid mentioned questions may be asked about incorporating PLSS to make parcels more accurate going forward.

8. Next Gen 9-1-1 Updates, Jessica Jimenez – (Dept. of Military Affairs)

- Will be presenting at Fall Regional meeting. Seeking input for topics of discussion.
- Dorn (Winnebago) suggested AT&T vendor timeline.
- Jimenez mentioned each county should be focusing on “Critical errors” from the statewide data gap analysis.
- Sommers mentioned WI was in the ~97.5% average as related to critical errors. Still more work to be done.

9. Snowmobile Trail Aids

- Sommers described program funding aid and plans by DNR to GPS trails.
- Sommers sought feedback on membership practices regarding snowmobile trails. Mentioned Copyright, data privacy by snowmobile clubs, etc.

- Romportl (Oneida) mentioned the county charges no admin fee. Also, the clubs in Oneida sell advertising to support map printing, so do not want maps on web. Oneida also mapping intersections for E911.
- Grassl (Vilas County) said his trails handled by Forestry Dept. They also have an agreement to not produce paper maps. The GIS data is public and provided at no fee.
- Sommers said DNR may address LION in future regarding the GPS program.

10. LION Website Domain Registration Fee

- Form developed to provide continuity from board to board for maintenance of 2/year and 1/year domain fees.
- Payment responsibility falls on appointee/volunteer which can be the LION chair.
- Collection will be made at Annual conference.
- Motion to approve form (Resolution 2021-10-29) by Rob Sommers. Second by Kevin Etherton. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Any other business
